## News: Gilmer Renovations, Shell Build and more





The Gilmer Center continues to undergo renovations to better serve our groups. The women's bathroom has been completely gutted and re-engineered to bring four shower stalls, one tub/shower, two commodes and the vanity is about to receive an upgrade with an additional faucet. Pine dividers, ceiling and trim add a rustic vibe to a great new space to cleanup after a hard day of work! Each shower includes a private changing area just a step from the stall. The men's

bathroom is set to undergo renovations shortly.

Five bedrooms require quite a bit of area and the soil in the undeveloped area of Milford Meadows is undergoing work via a soil engineer to find the right placement now that the precipitatory part of winter has vacated. The walls for the house were built by our first collegiate challenge groups of the season. We are looking forward to raising them this spring!

As of March 1st, there are four approved Partner Families working on their sweat equity to move to the construction phase! In addition to the three families currently in the construction/closing phase.


